### MAY 2014 SPRING RALLY REPORT



As you faithful newsletter readers know, the 2014 Spring Rally was held at the Golden Village Palm Resort in Hemet, CA. 50 coaches and 9 coachless made the trip including 6 first timers.

The first Day activities began with a presentation by Dean Ansley, representing SKY Med. Sky Med offers several traveler medical evacuation plans that are worth investigating. The Sky Med programs can be found at skymed.com or by phone 800.475.9633. The Ansleys provided beverages for the evening social hour. The first evening began with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Ralph Mundia, a member of the "Greatest Generation" followed by an outstanding catered meal. The tables were decorated with pots of cacti provided by Donna and Dave de Graffenreid. The pots were raffled off later on the last night

Planned activities and seminars began on Friday and continued through Sunday.

The technical sessions began with Miguel Mendez of MGM GMC presenting information on the new MSD Atomic fuel injection system that allows us to replace the old Quadrajet Carb. The Atomic is an easy to install, self learning system that requires no computer skills to get up and running. The kit includes all the pieces except the inexpensive adapter plate needed to adapt to the spread bore 455, 403 manifold. Miguel has installed some 20 of these for satisfied owners. One of these owners, Fin Bevin, provided his coach for a viewing. The Atomic has received CARB approval for use on pre '87 GM cars and trucks (coaches) in California making it smog legal. Be sure to get the CARB sticker affixed on the engine.

Garry Bovee showed his latest development; the electronic ignition system for the Onan generator with a fully illustrated installation presentation. This is another do-it-yourself upgrade. The round table problem, solution discussions were led by Miguel with Jim Kanamato contributing from his vast store of experience. Much useful information was interchanged, with vapor locking problems generating many helpful suggestions. Installing an auxiliary electric fuel pump near the tanks was one of the favorites. We all learned something. An informal demonstration was conducted by Master Mechanic Bob Lamey and his less than talented aid (me) on how to replace the failed alternator and diode isolator on the Wykle's coach.

Vendors present were Jim K with a sampling of his vast array of parts and accessories and a good supply of current catalogs. Gary Bovee's display included his Onan electronic ignition system, and belt tensioners. George Banovich , the master wood craftsman, displayed an array of clever, useful wood products for use inside and outside of the coach.

The swap meet offered an opportunity to acquire some valuable treasures and the way to get rid of the unwanted

# WESTERN STATES TECH CENTER

## THE HEMET RALLY AND CARB.

We had a very successful rally in Hemet, CA this past month. The facilities were great, the staff was wonderful and the GMC-ers attending were outstanding company. For being in the "desert", the weather was interesting. We had sun, wind and rain but overall nice mild temps.

The tech presentations were well attended and of great interest to all GMCers. Gary Bovee, of the "Idiots Guide to the GMC" information and CD, presented the upgrade for your Onan generator. He built a kit to improve the spark timing of the Onan with a Pertronic's module, which sends the signal to the coil with reliability and keeps your old pushrod system as a backup. He described the install in detail and answered many questions on the subject. The install should take an hour or two depending on how fast you can find your tools and the IB weld sets on the flywheel. (You have JB weld in stock? If not you will need to purchase one in addition to the kit). We all have too many tools and can find none when we need them. His kit and the info are available on the web at: http://gmcidiotsguide.com/ joomla/gmc-products/product/27-bovee-s-electronic-ignition-kit/ category\_pathway-25 . Thank you Gary, for a great presentation and a super upgrade to our Onan generator.

Miguel Mendez (MGMGMC in Montclair, CA) gave a presentation on the MSD Atomic Throttle Body Fuel injection (TBI). His hour-long detailed information on the installation and operation of the MSD unit proved to be of great interest to the GMC community. Most owners have had issues with the carburetor in their coaches and are looking for an alternative or improvement. GMCers who have pre-1976 coaches do not need to smog their units in CA; only on resale will they need to get a smog certificate. Those with 1976 and later models still are required to smog every two years. There has been no movement in our legislature to return to the former "rolling 25 year" model of smog certification, which by now would have exempted all GMCs. Miguel has installed 26 MSD TBI's in various coaches and reports no negative issues and some claim to get better fuel mileage. The important thing to note is that the TBI affords a more controlled and stable engine operation, especially with the addition of the spark control HEI unit (sold separately). The TBI monitors the exhaust gases with an O2 sensor in the tailpipe and regulates the fuel input, and the HEI changes the advance timing, both of which are controlled by same computer.

The MSD Atomic TBI has recently received an EO (Executive order D-722) from the California Air Resources Board, which makes it legal for all GM passenger car and pickup trucks pre-87 to have this unit and it will pass a smog inspection. The attached web page points to the EO as written by CARB: http://arb.ca.gov/msprog/aftermkt/devices/eo/D-722.pdf

But upon further examination it does NOT include our beloved GMC, since the regulation does not specifically name the GMC in the EO. Even the fact that we have a GM-Oldsmobile car engine does not matter. Gary Bovee (thank you for your extra efforts) has contacted the manager of the CARB section responsible for the EO and was told "NO, the RV is not included.". The MSD TBI would need to be certified by CARB, inside a GMC motorhome and pass, in order to be allowed for a smog exception. Antonio Martino is the contact person and manager for the Aftermarket Parts Section of CARB. His phone number is: (626) 575-6848. His email address is amartino@arb.ca.gov.

Sadly, yes, it is a good improvement for those that can use it, but it will not pass the visual smog inspection in post 1976 coaches.

Following his TBI presentation, Miguel with Chuck Botts at his side, held an hour-long open forum on any subject pertaining to the GMC. He was assisted by Jim Kanomata of Applied GMC and Bob Lamey during the discussions. Their insights are invaluable to our community and they represent the best source of information on the West Coast. We appreciate their involvement and attendance at these rallies.

A second open forum was held on Sunday morning with Ken Booth, Gary Bovee and I. We covered many issues and deferred to the experts as needed.

During the rally we had the usual repairs and installs on the coaches. Some bought items from our vendors to install, while others sought the help from fellow GMCers to do the work. Jim Kanomata, Gary Bovee and George Banovich displayed their wares in the Ballroom for the duration of the rally, and several members sold items from their coaches during the swap meet.

While we had a great time there, we missed several of our regular members who contribute to the tech sessions and give so freely of their time and expertise to our members. Please come to the next rally in Manteca, CA.
